1. Judges involvement forms are due 1 month earlier this year. JCI testing of judges has gone in-house to USAG.
2. Encourage your athletes to send cards to the National Training Camp. The Olympic athletes will not be able to receive cards etc at the Olympics because of security reasons. The training camp address is USA Gymnastics Training Camp Camp 454 Forest Service Rd Huntsville, TX 77340. They will be breaking into other sports on the TV to announce the team on July 18th.
3. Regional bids are due prior to TO regional congress (level 8 Regionals will be by itself and level 9/10 will be together).
4. Great job Cyndi on score tracking! Norbert has had many other states ask how we track our athletes. Connie was nominated for the Silver Mouse Award for the Illinois Web Site.
5. In the new cycle level 8's will be allowed to do yurchenko's with a twist or a flip (not both) and level 9's will be allowed to do all current level 10 vaults.
6. Congress Update-
Banquet – Final numbers are in and we have 225 people signed up for the banquet. We are looking into having an additional gift for all graduating seniors. Next year it is recommended to have the banquet for level 6 and up since level 5 has 3 state meets. This will be discussed later.
Training Camp – 220 athletes are signed up but we are still in need for coaches.
Congress – There will be an open discussion on Sunday morning for both boards and coaches together. Everything will be on site this year.
7. Next year we will have State congress, recognition banquet and compulsory clinics. National Congress will be in Indy next year. There will be not Regional Congress due to National Congress occurring in our regional
8. State/Regional Calendar –
Level 4/5 state will be moved to April 9th and 10th. Motion by Sari, Judy seconded, unanimous.
9. Format for state meets.
When submitting bids we will accept bids on whatever format the host club wants to do but will accept on what we feel is the best fit for that state meet. Motion by Randy, Cyndi seconded, unanimous.

The JO Chair will overlook all state series meet formats (can change to make the meet run smoother – but up to the JO Chair and his sub committee. (Committee consist of compulsory chairs and JO for compulsory state meets and optional chairs and JO for optional state meets) Motion by Judy, Teresa seconded, unanimous.

You may bid on a state series meet as long as you meet requirements: site (in or out of house), past history, organization, and support groups will be considered. Motion by Sari, Judy seconded, passed (1 opposed).

For all state series meets age groups will be divided by birthdates (so we have equal age groups by size) for all levels using the level 10 format. Appropriate formula will be applied according to the format (traditional or capital cup). Motion by Cyndi, Randy seconded, unanimous.
10. Team Awards
Level 9 and 10 will have combined team awards only. Levels 4-8 will have age group team awards and combined awards.

Team awards will be handed out 50% or maximum 10 places. Motion by Judy, Teresa seconded, unanimous.
11. FYI– All athletes are being tracked as to what level they have been mobilized up to and if they have qualified for their respective state series meet.
12. Entry forms must be filled out correctly or will be sent back and subject to fines. Out of state meet results have to

- be sent in. The coach is responsible for providing the out of state scores if they want them to count.
13. The JO Chair will be sending state series meet directors something saying they received the bid and a package on what the expectations and responsibilities are for hosting a state series meet.
14. Meet Ref Responsibilities – Hotel accommodations (days, smoking pref., pairing people up), Meal arrangements (breakfast on site or hotel), check measurements of meet, responsible for itemized bills, handle inquiries, arrange car pools, have meet schedule ahead of time for judges, need TV/VCR available for base score, after assigning events send assignments to JO and the State Chair.
15. Awards –
All level 5 sanctioned meets must hand out achievement awards as a minimum (placement awards are optional). Motion by Sari, Teresa seconded, unanimous.
16. The new compulsories will have competitive level 2 and 3's.
17. Judges Selections –
 National – Sandy Oldham and Hilary Carlson recommended
 Regional – Aug 1st involvement forms are due back. We have to make our recommendations by Oct 1st.
 State – We will pick the same way as last year and have assigners there to answer factual questions.
18. Communication Process – When communicating via email make sure that you put the RE topic in your responses. When doing anything by Internet Norbert will be putting a deadline for discussion then a final date for voting.
19. All board members are to fill out chart on duties and responsibilities and email to Norbert by the next meeting.
20. Go online to complete review of the R&P. The final version will be sent out by September 1st.
21. Soon we will be able to do all elections by using the Internet and doing them electronically. On the web page we will be making an update page that will be minutes and updated rules and changes.
22. Professionalism – Lanyards must be worn at all meets. Norbert will be sending out a note before state series meets about a dress code.
23. Meet directors need to check professional numbers and make sure that coaches are wearing their lanyards.
24. New Business –
Regional coaches will be given one collared shirt (1/club per regional) with others available at cost. Randy will be doing a letter that will go out with the regional Leo's to ask for everyone sizes and to recommend everyone wear the Leo's and shirts at the regional competitions. Motion by Sari, Teresa seconded, unanimous.
- Judges selections and state series selection meeting will be September 19th at noon.
- Meet scheduling meeting will be August 1st at noon.
- It is required to file all meet results electronically this year. If you are unaware on how to do it please contact Cyndi who can walk you through it. More details will be handed out at the scheduling meeting.
- If you do not send in your meet results electronically you will be fined \$1/athlete in addition to the competition fee you pay. Motion by Mary Jo, Sari seconded, unanimous.*
- We recommend that the judges in Illinois continue to check scores at each meet. Motion by Teresa, Judy seconded, unanimous.*

 1. Must have qualified for the 2004 Level 10 Nationals
 2. Average of your top four JO meet scores for the 2004 season
 3. Only one score can be from a home sponsored event (not counting States, Regionals, or Nationals if you are the host club) and there must be at least two other Level 10 Teams represented.
 4. Must have attended either SUPER/HOT SHOT/HI TECH/FORWARD PROGRESS Region V Training Camps in 2004 as these are the camps that fund the international assignments.
 5. An invitational score may only be used once
 - a. A preliminary and finals score from the same invitational may not be used
 6. Official meet score sheets must be turned in to John Geddert by July 1, 2004
 - a. No late entries will be accepted
 7. Athletes who will be moving onto college will still be named to the All Star Squad BUT will not be considered for the international assignment.
 8. Athletes must have been an active member living in Region V for one complete year starting August 1.
 - b. Top four Elite International Athletes
 1. Based on the rankings from the Championships of the USA
 2. Two junior and two senior spots
 3. National team members will be named to the All Star Team BUT will not be eligible for international trip due to the overwhelming number of conflicts with national team obligations.
 4. Spots vacated will be filled in rank order with a junior replacing a junior or senior replacing a senior from Championship of the USA and then Classics if necessary.
 5. If spots remain open, they will be filled by a rank order of JO Athletes starting with number nine.

Letter to the Membership regarding the certification of women's judges.

Last month the decision was made to bring the entire process for the certification of judges in-house at the USA Gymnastics National Office. This has been discussed by the last three Presidents of USA Gymnastics because according to the Amateur Sports Act, a National Governing Body is responsible for the training and certification of its judges. The NGBs of Swimming, Track and Field, Volleyball, and Synchronized Swimming (to name a few) are currently managing this responsibility in-house. USA Gymnastics manages the certification of its judges for Rhythmic, Trampoline and Tumbling and Sports Acro under the jurisdiction of their program committee as defined in our By-laws. Eventually the certification of judges for all disciplines will come in-house.

Historically, what we now all know as JCI (Judges' Certification, Inc.) was originally a joint committee consisting of a sub-committee of the USGF Technical Committee and the NAGWS (National Association for Girls and Women's Sports) formed in the late 60's. In 1984, five women involved in the joint effort incorporated to establish an organization independent of USGF and NAGWS. This was done primarily because the USGF had informed the Joint Committee that funding would not be available. During this time, the Joint Committee also produced the compulsory exercises and conducted the Master workshops. Their hope was also to become a voting member of the USGF Board of Directors. Since they did not fulfill the requirements for a seat on the Board, this goal was not realized.

As you may know, USGF assumed the responsibility of the drafting and development of the compulsory exercises and the workshops in 1989. Since that time, the compulsory project has appropriately been under the jurisdiction of the Junior Olympic Committee.

The certification of Brevet, Elite and National judges has always been conducted and managed by the USA Gymnastics National Office. This number will include approximately 110 Brevets and 500 plus National Level judges at the Brevet and National Courses to be conducted in 2005. It is not a new endeavor for us.

The Women's Technical Committee will now be designing the tests and testing procedures. We do not anticipate any major changes. We hope to be using many of the same individuals for both the design and the administration of the test.

JCI has done an exemplary job of managing this task over the years and has set a high standard for us to maintain and build upon. Our main goals will be to continue with the same level of service, lower the cost of testing for our members, and provide on-line registration process. We can do this because of the lower overhead and the advances in technology that are now available to us.

The first benefit that all Brevet, National, and Level 10 recertification-eligible judges will see is that they will not be required to pay an additional administrative fee to receive a JCI certification card. Another benefit will be that our data base at USA Gymnastics will be able to house information that will allow us to directly communicate with our judges when important updates are needed to be disseminated quickly. Presently, there is no coding to indicate a judge's rating in the data base for a Professional Member unless he/she is a Brevet or National judge. Since your certification is based on the levels for the USAG Jr. Olympic Program, it is only reasonable that the USAG National Office have that information available in our computer system.

We understand and are sensitive to your concerns about maintaining confidentiality. We anticipate designating and training one individual to manage the administration of this program. This person will report directly to Connie Maloney and will be under the direction of the Women's Program Staff and the Women's Technical Committee.

We believe that judges at all levels are most important to our athletes. Our judges are among the best in the world as our program is the most highly developed. We pledge to serve you with the respect you have earned and deserve.
