
Judge Selection Procedure: Nationals, Regional, & State. Changed!

The ultimate responsibility of selecting judges lies with the USAG Committee (State & Regional) as per National R&P;.

National / Regional Meet Judge The Regional Committee determines our National and Regional Judges by reviewing the list submitted by our State Committee choices. Site of meet, experience, Ratings, Regional Training Camp, Etc. as a basis for recommendations to both the National and Regional Meets is used during the evaluation process. The top 2 to from last year's Regional list will be use due to timetable.

Regional Meet Judge Recommendations The USAG Committee uses the recommendations of the NAWGJ Board along with listing the eligible Judges. The Committee listed the judges eligible (eligibility requirements: Professional Involvement Forms, Regional Training Camp participation, and Meet date availability. in the order that each committee member wanted to see at the Regional Meets. Each committee Chair submitted their list of the Judges that they would like to see Judge at Regional Meets. Each Committee member submitted to the State Chair the judges eligible in order from 1 to These were the calculated buy giving a point value to each place 1=1, 2=2, 3=3, 4=4, etc. The Judge with the lowest average would be placed on the top of our list. This rank order list was the Submitted to Char Christensen the Regional RTC.

State Meet Judges 2004-2005 season

- The NAWGJ Board submits a listing of judges including Professional Involvement Forms, active status, and history of levels judged the prior season. The data is compiled and presented to the State USG Committee.
- A USAG Committee meeting is held to determine the judges to be selected for the Stae Series
 - The committee establishes the best judge for a specific level of meet
 - Regardless of the number of State Meets assigned
 - Judges Availability for the specific weekends (North South Assignors present to assistance)
 - Rotation of judges not to be part of the consideration
- The USAG Committee starts with the Level 9 & 10 State meets and proceeds in order down to the list Level 8, Level 7 etc.
 - Of the available judges, the Meet referee is chosen first, then the Head Judges then the panel judges and finally alternates (event not assigned that duty is the responsibility of the Meet Referee).
 - Each meet referee, head judge and panel judges are voted on by the USAG Committee

The Committee uses as a basis for their judgment information gleaned by numerous conversations, written and observations etc. with the professional members of our State. We highly encourage your input. The NAWGJ has an ethic committee to report in writing any judging situations that might help us in this process.

We use this rather complicated procedure in an effort to provide the fairest and most impartial form of selection. WE understand that no system is perfect, but feel this is the best method of selection.
