Bids are now being accepted for Regional Championships hosts.

Each regional competition has a "priority state" as determined by the the regional rotation schedule which is alphabetical through the states. If there is not a favorable bid from the "priority state", bids from all other states will be considered.

Bids must be submitted <u>online</u> by October 15, 2023. Incomplete or late bids will not be considered.

What's New for the 2022-2023 Season

The RACC held its summer meeting in July. Minutes are posted on the Region 5 website. Below are highlights of some changes taking effect in the 2022-2023 season:

- Second alternates for Dev Nationals will now receive athlete apparel. (This is for Level 10 only)
- Due to the increase of expenses for host clubs, entry fees and gate fees for regional competitions have increased to:
 - Level 9/10 Regional Championships:
 - \$140/gymnast entry fee
 - \$20 maximum for adults for admission per day
 - Level 6-8 Regional Championships:
 - \$125/gymnast entry
 - \$20 maximum for adults for admission per day
 - Xcel Regional Championships:
 - \$100/gymnast entry fee
 - \$20 maximum for adults for admission per day
- The regional qualifying score was raised to a 36.50 for Xcel Silver.
- State teams at Xcel Regional Meets will each have 8 gymnasts. The Diamonds will have one team and all other divisions will have an A and B team.
- Level 6/7/8 Regional Championships will now have 4judge panels for all levels.

Clarification: Coaches apparel will now be awarded by club and not to the specific coach. Therefore, if the same coach works two full camps, that club will be eligible to get two sets of apparel for their club (if needed) if they have a gymnast(s) who qualifies for Eastern Nationals or Dev Nationals. If you have questions about this, please let us know.

Please be sure to thoroughly read and review your state rules & policies and the USAG Women's Rules & Policies for additional changes and updates.



Regional Championships Reminders

Regional Championships are coming soon! We would like to provide you with some important information and reminders so that your post season goes smoothly.

REGIONAL ENTRIES

All regional entries must be completed and paid for at your state competition.

All qualified athletes and those that are petitioning must be entered using the USAG reservation system at the state meet. Please be sure that at least one of your coaches that is attending the meet is designated as an administrator for your club so this can be completed.

Payments for regional entries must be submitted at the state meet. Payments should include all qualifying athletes and those that are petitioning.

PETITIONS

Gymnasts may be petitioned to Level 8, 9 or 10 Regionals because of illness, injury or a family tragedy, e.g., death, natural disaster. Please note that there are no petitions to regional championships for Levels 6, 7, or Xcel.

A gymnast may compete in her State Meet in 1, 2 or 3 events and still petition. Touching out is NOT considered competing on the event. Any gymnast that competes 4 events at state meet is NOT eligible to petition to regional championships.

INDIVIDUAL EVENT SPECIALISTS (IES)

Gymnasts competing as Individual Event Specialists must be designated as such before the start of competition. Once competition begins, athletes not designated as an IES will be considered as all-arounders.

DP State Team Competition

State team competitions will be held at Levels 6, 7, 8 and Xcel Regional Championships.

Using all around scores, the top 8 gymnasts in each regional age group will make up each state team. Please note that state meet age groups may differ from regional age groups. State team members will be determined after all state meets are completed and after all regional entries are received. State team members will be published on the Region 5 website.

The top 4 scores will count toward the team score.

State team members that scratch before the start of the competition will be replaced by the gymnast with the next highest AA. No replacements will be made once the competition has begun.

Xcel State Team Competition

State team competitions will be held at Xcel Regional Championships.

State teams for Silver, Gold and Platinum divisions will consist of top 16 gymnasts at each division determined by all-around score with no regard to age groups. They will be divided into two teams per state based on rank score. Team 1 is gymnasts ranking 1-8, and team 2 is gymnasts ranking 9-16.

State teams for the Diamond division will consist of the top 8 gymnasts determined by all-around score with no regard to age groups. There will only be one team for the Diamond division because the numbers of gymnasts are much lower than other divisions.

The top 4 scores on each event will be used to determine the team score.

State team members that scratch before the start of the competition will be replaced by the gymnast with the next highest AA. No replacements will be made once the competition has begun.

REGIONAL SUPER TEAM COMPETITIONS

Each state team will compete to earn points for the Super State Team competition. Super State Team is determined by assigning points for placement within each age group as follows:

- 1st Place = 5 points
- 2nd Place = 4 points
- 3rd Place = 3 points
- 4th Place = 2 points
- 5th Place = 1 point

Balance Beam Skill Cushion Rules

Please remember that per the Women's DP Code of Points, any combination of skill cushions, max. 9" sting mats, 4" throw and/or 8" skill cushions may be placed on top of allowable competition landing mats in two (2) separate areas (under beam and/or dismount area).

If you choose to use a mat underneath the beam or to the side of the beam (for a side dismount) you may only use one other mat at the end of the beam.

You may find this information in the Women's DP Code of Points under Balance Beam Apparatus Regulations.

Level 10 Athlete Eligibility Rules for Free Region 5 Apparel

Level 10 athletes who meet the following criteria will qualify for free Region 5 apparel:

Criteria #1

• Athlete has qualified to DP Nationals

OR

 Athlete is a 1st Alternate who has committed to attending Nationals and has paid for her athlete hotel room during the 9 & 10 Regional Meet (if applicable). This includes Region 5 Athletes who qualify to compete for another region and athletes who qualify to compete in the wildcard session.

Criteria #2

 The athlete's gym has participated in a Region 5 Training Camp for the current competitive season by registering and sending athletes to train at one or more camps. The specific athlete who qualifies to DP Nationals does NOT need to have attended a camp personally. However, if the qualifying athlete attended a Region 5 Training camp for the current competitive season, the region will pay her DP Nationals entry fee.

Second alternates are invited and encouraged to attend DP Nationals. If they are called up to compete or are moved to the first alternate spot, athletes who meet the eligibility requirements, will receive all apparel that remains available. The athlete must attend DP Nationals to receive Region 5 Apparel.

If an athlete meets the qualification requirements outlined in criteria #1, but the athlete's gym did not attend this season's Region 5 Training Camps, the athlete can still receive all Region 5 apparel with a donation to the Region 5 Apparel Fund.

Donations must be a minimum of \$300/gym for one qualified athlete or \$600/gym for two or more qualified athletes. Checks should be made payable to Region 5 USAG and must be given to Patrick Jordan at Regionals.

All qualifying athletes and a parent or guardian should be prepared to stay at the conclusion of the awards ceremony for a National Qualifiers Processing meeting. Parents/Guardians will need to be prepared to pay for the athlete hotel room at that time. Please allow 1.5 to 2 hours for processing and media.

Level 9 Athlete Eligibility Rules for Free Region 5 Apparel

Level 9 athletes who meet the following criteria will qualify for free Region 5 apparel:

Criteria #1

Athlete has qualified to Eastern Nationals

OR

 Athlete is a 1st Alternate who has committed to attending Eastern Nationals

Criteria #2

 The athlete's gym has participated in a Region 5 Training Camp for the current competitive season by registering and sending athletes to train at one or more camps. The specific athlete who qualifies to Eastern Nationals does NOT need to have attended a camp personally. However, if the qualifying athlete attended a Region 5 Training camp for the current competitive season, the region will pay her Eastern Nationals entry fee.

Second alternates are invited and encouraged to attend Eastern Nationals. If they are called up to compete or are moved to the first alternate spot, athletes who meet the eligibility requirements, will receive all apparel that remains available. The athlete must attend Eastern Nationals to receive Region 5 Apparel.

If an athlete meets the qualification requirements outlined in criteria #1, but the athlete's gym did not attend this season's Region 5 Training Camps, the athlete can still receive all Region 5 apparel with a donation to the Region 5 Apparel Fund.

Donations must be a minimum of \$125/gym for one qualified athlete or \$250/gym for two or more qualified athletes.

Checks should be made payable to Region 5 USAG and must be given to Patrick Jordan at Regionals.

All qualifying athletes and a parent or guardian should be prepared to stay at the conclusion of the awards ceremony for an Eastern Nationals Qualifiers Processing meeting. Please allow 1 hour for processing.

Level 9 & 10 Coaches Eligibility Rules for Free Region 5 Apparel

Coaches who meet the following criteria will qualify for free Region 5 apparel:

Criteria #1

 Have an athlete has qualified to DP Nationals or Eastern Nationals

OR

 Have an athlete that is a 1st alternate who has committed to attending DP Nationals and has paid for her athlete hotel room during the 9 & 10 Regional Meet (if applicable). This includes Region 5 Athletes who qualify to compete for another region and athletes who qualify to compete in the wildcard session. has paid for her athlete hotel room during the 9 & 10 Regional meet (if applicable). This includes Region 5 Athletes who qualify to compete for another region and athletes who qualify to compete in the wildcard session.

OR

 Have an athlete that is a 1st alternate who has committed to attending Eastern Nationals.

Criteria #2

 The specific coach must have worked at least one complete Region 5 training camp for the current competitive season.

Coaches who are not eligible for free Region 5 apparel must purchase the required apparel to be worn on the competitive floor. Additional items will also be available for purchase but are not mandatory.

Level 10 DP Nationals Wildcard Qualification

New in 2022, USA Gymnastics is introducing a Wildcard session, which has the potential to include 22 additional athletes per region. This new opportunity, developed and introduced by former R5 coach, Brett Wargo, will give more athletes the opportunity to participate at a national level.

The athletes with the top 2 AA scores, regardless of age group, that are not in the top 7 in their age group or competing for another region will qualify to compete in the Wildcard session on Friday evening. These athletes may be alternates for their age group.

In addition, the top 5 athletes, regardless of age group, on each event that did not qualify in the all around and scored at least a 9.3 will also qualify to compete on that event in the Wildcard session on Friday evening. Athletes may qualify on more than one event.

If an athlete declines her spot or scratches due to illness or injury, the spot is vacated; i.e. the number 6 athlete would NOT move into a qualifying position.

There will be a "running list" after each session at regionals of provisional qualifiers. Provisional qualifiers, their parent(s), and coach(es) will need to stay for the DP Nationals meeting and apparel sizing if you are accepting the spot. Provisional qualifiers will be sized only. At the end of all level 10 sessions, qualifiers will be determined and coaches will be notified of final qualifiers. Apparel will be sent to to each qualifier. If you have any questions, please let us know. We are excited about this new opportunity for our athletes!

Updated COVID Guidance for Non-National Sanctioned Events

The updated guidance for Sanctioned Events, including state and regional competitions, can be found <u>HERE</u>.

USA Gymnastics highly recommends and encourages all sanctioned event participants and spectators to follow CDC guidelines throughout any USA Gymnastics sanctioned competition.

We remind event directors and clubs that sanctioned events are required to be conducted in a manner that is permitted by, and in compliance with, their local government guidelines.

Event Directors should communicate their specific event's facial and social distancing protocols in pre-event and on-site communication. USA Gymnastics has developed signage and flyers to help meet directors with this communication.

Further, all event directors have the authority to enforce and require measures to provide participants with a safe event environment. Specifically, event directors have the authority to:

- remove and/or disqualify any participants, clubs, coaches, athletes, judges, other sanctioned event staff, and spectators who fail or refuse to comply with local ordinances, such as non-compliance of facial covering and/or social distancing mandates.
- eliminate and/or reduce the number of spectators to maintain the appropriate social distancing protocol. Event directors should communicate all restrictions clearly to all parents/guardians and seek creative solutions for parental viewing to comply with Safe Sport requirements, such as allowing one person from each club to live stream their athletes on a private club page and/or live streaming the entire event using a third-party vendor.
- require the use of facial covering and social distancing protocols throughout a USA Gymnastics Sanctioned event, unless specifically prohibited by local regulation.

Elite Drop Backs

A US Elite gymnast (an athlete who has competed as a Junior or Senior International Elite in a Classic Meet, Junior World Trials, or higher) who wants to enter the DP Program MUST petition to drop back to the DP program, regardless of the year of competition, by completing the "reason for change" form FROM HER COACH to the National DP Committee Chairman. For Information regarding Foreign Athlete (Elite or non-elite) participation in the DP, please refer to Chapter 2, page 26.

- a. All petitions must be received at least three (3) weeks prior to the Level 10 State Championships.
- b. The National DP Committee will review the petition and the Chairman will notify the coach of the acceptance/denial of the petition and will copy the respective State and Regional Administrative Committee Chairman and the Regional Technical Committee Chairman.
- c. Accepted petitioned athletes may not re-enter the Elite/Pre-Elite Program during the Elite competitive year (through Championships of the year in which she competes Level 10).
- d. Clarification: An elite athlete dropping back into the Development Program is considered a DP athlete when she enters her first USA Gymnastics sanctioned event as a Level 10 athlete AFTER the petition has been granted.
- e. All scores obtained before the petition is granted are INVALID for qualification to State Championships and above in the current season.
- f. Any gymnast who competed at the Pre-Elite level (at a Regional or National qualifier and/or Challenge competition) may choose to compete as a Level 10 in the following season since she is considered as a Pre-Elite athlete. No petition is necessary.

Once an athlete competes in a Classic (regardless of year), she is considered an Elite level gymnast. A drop-back petition must be received for any athlete falling under these circumstances, regardless of the amount of time that has passed.

Elite Athletes are allowed to compete in DP invitationals in the Open Division, but if the intention is for her to be eligible for the DP Program in 2022, a petition must be received. Any scores achieved in an invitational before the petition is approved will be invalid so she would not be eligible to qualify to State, Regionals, Nastia Liukin Cup, etc.





U112 Course Reminder for Professional Members

The deadline to take <u>U112:</u>
<u>Tough Coaching or Emotional</u>
<u>Abuse: Knowing when the line</u>
<u>has been crossed</u>, was January
10, 2022. The following
<u>membership roles</u> are required
to have completed this course:
 competitive coach,
 organizational
owner/managing director and
recreational coach.

Failure to complete this course will result in your membership being placed in a pending status until the course is completed. Members with a pending status will be denied floor access to sanctioned events. Please be sure that you have completed this course to avoid any problems at competitions!



IRS Mileage Reimbursement Rate for 2022

The Internal Revenue Service today issued the 2022 optional standard mileage rates used to calculate the deductible costs of operating an automobile for business,

Beginning on January 1, 2022, the standard mileage rates for the use of a car (also vans, pickups or panel trucks) will be:

- 58.5 cents per mile driven for business use
- (up 2.5 cents from the rate for 2021)

The standard mileage rate for business use is based on an annual study of the fixed and variable costs of operating an automobile. The rate for medical and moving purposes is based on the variable costs.

 - Must be completed by January 10, 2022
 - 60 minutes to complete

2022 National and Eastern National Sites Announced

USA Gymnastics recently announced that the 2022 USA Gymnastics Development Program National Championships will be held May 10-15, 2022, at Bell Bank Park powered by Legacy Sports USA in Mesa, Arizona. The competition will be a combined men's and women's championship.

The 2022 USAG Women's Artistic Development Program Level 9 Eastern Championships will take place May 5-8, 2022. The Eastern Championships, hosted by Rochester Gymnastics Academy, will be held at the Golisano Training Center in Rochester, New York.



New in 2022, USA Gymnastics is introducing a Wildcard Individual Event Specialist session, which has the potential to include 22 additional athletes per region. This new opportunity, developed and introduced by former R5 coach, Brett Wargo, will give more athletes the opportunity to participate at a national level.

The athletes with the top 2 AA scores, regardless of age group, that are not in the top 7 in their age group or competing for another region will qualify to compete in a Wildcard session on Friday evening. These athletes may be alternates for their age group.

In addition, the top 5 athletes, regardless of age group, on each event that did not qualify in the all around and scored at least a 9.3 will also qualify to compete in the Wildcard session on Friday evening. Athletes may qualify on more that one event.

A couple of things to note:

- Ties will be broken by highest event score for AA. Ties will NOT be broken for individual events.
- If an athlete declines her spot or scratches due to illness or injury, the spot is vacated; I.e. the number 6 athlete would NOT move into a qualifying position.

There will be a "running list" after each session at regionals of provisional qualifiers. Provisional qualifiers, their parent(s), and coach(es) will need to stay for the DP Nationals meeting and apparel sizing if you are accepting the spot. Provisional qualifiers will be sized only. At the end of all level 10 sessions, qualifiers will be determined and coaches will be notified of final qualifiers. Apparel will be sent to to each qualifier. If you have any questions, please let us know. We are excited about this new opportunity for our athletes!

Reminders for Meet Directors

USA Gymnastics has several new requirements for meet directors. Be sure you are compliant with all new rules and regulations. Click the link below to make sure your event is Safe Sport compliant.

Safe Sport for Event Directors

Regional Payments

Within 24 hours of the conclusion of any USA
Gymnastics sanctioned meet (this includes mobility meets), meet directors are required to send a copy of the sanction and \$1 per competing athlete to:

Scores and sign-in sheets do not need to be included.

If you are hiring a company to manage your meet, it is the hosting club's responsibility to make sure that payment is sent.

Clubs that have outstanding payments will be considered "not in good standing". Clubs not in good standing:

- May not be considered to host regional camps or competitions.
- Will not have Easterns or Nationals gymnast entry fees paid by the region.

Health Insurance Benefits for Professional Members

Clarification: Petitioning to Level 6 or 7

Per the Women's Rules & Policies (p. 81), any gymnast who has had previous competitive experience other than USA Gymnastics but including USA Gymnastics Xcel athletes, and who is a minimum of 12 years of age is eligible to petition by submitting a formal written request to the State Administrative Committee for entry into Level 7 and below.

Please note that USAG has clarified that a gymnast that competed Level 4 last season cannot move to the Xcel Program in order to petition back into the DP program at Level 6 or 7 therefore circumventing proper mobility through level 5.
